#### Tēnā koutou Families

Welcome back to you all and a special welcome to new families who have joined Ngaio School this year. Our invitation to our Whakatau to welcome new families will be sent out soon. Please save the date and attend if you can.

The school website has been updated with syndicate information. Please refer to this to find out what's happening for your tamariki this term.

Many of you will have heard in the media about the mathematics resources we've been offered. We have an important decision to make regarding the four options on offer - all resources have pros and cons and there are many ways that they can be used by kura, from wholesale adoption to supplementing other approaches. Evaluating the four comprehensive sets of resources is an important task and we are taking our time to make sure that decisions about resources reflect our beliefs, values and concerns about mathematics and statistics teaching and learning at Ngaio School. We already have a mathematics and statistics programme that we've developed over the past three years and we need this resource to add to our practice in ways that will support and enhance our current programmes.

We are therefore considering the potential the resources have to improve what we already do, without losing valued aspects of our current approaches. We want to ensure our choice supports our already effective mathematics teaching and learning - we want our choice of resource to make things better for all ākonga in our kura.

Another consideration is affordability of the resources long-term, given that Ministry of Education funding is only for two years.

We are holding the first of our Ministry of Education allocated teacher only days on 31 March. We will spend this day further exploring the revised mathematics curriculum.

This year we have some big fundraising priorities, primarily the resurfacing of our playgrounds, and the PTA will be playing a key role in helping the school to be able to undertake these projects. We have a small playground committee gathering soon to start making plans for grant applications, possible sponsorship opportunities and fundraising.

The PTA need more people to be able to make fundraising a reality for our tamariki. They are seeking a Fundraising Coordinator, general committee members and specialists who are happy to lend their skills on an ad hoc basis. Our school works with SchoolDocs to create a website for our policies and procedures.

The school works on a subscription basis with SchoolDocs to maintain, update, and review our policies. SchoolDocs provides us with a comprehensive core set of policies, which have been well researched and align with the National Education and Learning Priorities. The policies and procedures are tailored to our school, and the school supplies specific information such as our charter, and procedures for behaviour management, reporting to parents, etc.

SchoolDocs updates, modifies, or creates policies in response to changes in legislation or Ministry guidelines, significant events, reviews/requests from schools, and regular reviewing from the SchoolDocs team. Our school board has the opportunity to view changes/additions and comment on them before they are implemented. We will advise you when policies are up for review and how you can take part in the review.




