I have been working closely with management at TheY who run our Ngaio After School Care Programme (NOSCAR). It has been great to hear about improvements they have been making to their programme, including their booking system and a new manager, Donna. Donna is very experienced in running after school care programmes, bringing great programming knowledge & structure, strong relationships and communication skills to the programme. They have also recently employed two other new staff, Tash who has moved from Hawkes Bay and brings lots of previous experience, and Liam who also works at Ngaio School as a teacher aide. I'm told they've both settled in well and are a 'hit' with the kids!

Other important news is that In a couple of weeks TheY will be moving their programme into rooms 16 and 17. Check out the school website for up to date information about TheY. With the move of The Y to rooms 16 and 17, we will once again have access to McLeod Hall for school use. We're very excited by this and hope to soon be running events like hui from the hall.

We've recently been informed of an Education Review Office (ERO) Te Ara Huarau Evaluation for Ngaio School. ERO began implementing a new approach to school evaluation in February 2021. Although ERO's accountability function has not changed, the focus of the approach is school improvement with ERO and schools working together to ensure all learners in the school system are successful. Mary Ely and Michelle Irving are visiting the school in week 7, beginning Tuesday and feeding back on Thursday. We have been busy gathering the pre-review information they've requested, including our 2025 Strategic and Annual Plans. You can see our

PHONES AWAY FOR THE DAY REMINDER

From the start of Term 2 2024, regulations were introduced stating that schools must prohibit ākonga | students from using or accessing their phone while they are attending school, unless it is required for learning purposes, health reasons or directed by a teacher or the principal. Phones away for the day includes during lunch time and breaks, and when on a school course or visit outside the school grounds.

The intention of having ākonga | student phones away for the day is to improve engagement and achievement through minimising distractions during learning time and increasing social interaction while they are attending school.

The guidelines for the use of phones at ngaio School is detailed in our <u>Cellphones and Other Personal Digital Devices</u> policy [Login: Ngaio, Password: Abbott] (The policy also covers any personal digital device that is privately owned and not part of any school-approved Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) programme.

If you want to pay by credit card for your online Book Club order, **LOOP** makes it easy! It eliminates the need for paper order forms plus your online order is submitted to the school safe and sound.

Log-in to mybookclub.scholastic.co.nz or download our iPhone and iPad app from the App Store or get it on Google Play for Android.

- For a quick start, just click on ORDER in the top menu or REGISTER first to save your details for next time
- Select your school and your child's class
- Add your child's first name and last initial (so the school knows who the book is for)
- Enter the item number from the Book Club catalogue
- You can order for multiple children at once if they attend the same school
- All orders are linked directly to the school for submission to Scholastic. Books will still be delivered to your child's classroom if you order by the close date
- There's no need to return paper order forms or payment receipt details to your school!
